

Grade 7 Students Make a Special Delivery to the Wolfville Area Food Bank

The students organized a successful school-wide food drive as part of the Farm Credit Corporation's 'Drive Away Hunger' campaign. The food drive ran for several weeks, ending in mid-October.

FCC organizers came to the school to tally the total donations and weigh the impressive collection. We are all delighted to announce that **over 900 pounds of food** was collected for the local food bank.

Students then hit the street to personally deliver the food directly to the Wolfville Area Food Bank just a few blocks away.





The 3 classes of grade 7 students carried the huge collection of food items directly into the food bank storage area where it would be put on the shelves and used to fill next week's food bank clients' grocery orders.

Food bank volunteers were on hand, so students also took some time to ask questions and learn more about how the organization works to help people in the community.
